Bursaries and Awards

This brochure includes descriptions of the main awards and bursaries available to the students of BCHS through the BCHS Scholarship Trust Fund which provides financial aid to deserving graduates. The fund exists primarily through the generosity of the merchants and citizens of our community. Contributions are welcomed at any time.

Awards are determined by the Awards Committee and staff and are given at the Awards Night in the fall each year. This enables selection to be made on the basis of achievement on final examinations in both semesters. Qualification for the majority of these awards is based upon future educational plans, financial need and academic achievement. Application forms and further details may be obtained from Barrhead Composite High School Student Services.

Who qualifies for BCHS Bursaries and Awards?

Unless otherwise specified,

1. applicants must be enrolled in grade 12 in BCHS and
2. must not have received any bursaries or awards earlier and are attending a post secondary institution.

What happens when the recipients are chosen?

Recipients are

1. notified of their awards and invited to receive them at the Awards Night in September,
2. required to submit written confirmation of registration status issued by the office of the registrar of the post secondary institution.

What happens if the student delays entering further education after applying for an award?

Grade 12 students planning to return to BCHS and those planning to delay entrance into post secondary institutions may have their applications held for one year at which time they will be considered. They should indicate their plans on the application.



Awards

Shantell Storseth & Vicky Luciuk Memorial Scholarship (\$1000)

Established in 2001 in memory of Shantell Storseth and Vicky Luciuk, grade 11 students who tragically lost their lives in a vehicle accident. Scholarships of \$1000 will be awarded as selected by the BCHS Scholarship Selection Committee. Preference will be given to graduates who meet the requirements to be eligible for Rutherford Scholarship Funds, participate in at least three competitive sport activities such as a school sports team, Barrhead Minor Ball, Barrhead Minor Hockey or achieving a

provincial level in any other sport and who have plans to pursue a career in the medical field. Graduates are required to submit written applications to “The Vicky Luciuk & Shantell Storseth Scholarship Selection Committee”, c/o BCHS, including their goals and objectives in pursuing further education as well as the relevance of their study program for a career in the medical field and must include confirmation of their high school marks by a school official. Recipients must provide proof of registration at a recognized Alberta post-secondary institution prior to collecting this award.

Proof of Enrolment in to a post secondary institution is needed.

Performing Arts Bursary (\$500)

The Barrhead Arts Council provides a bursary of \$500 to a graduate who has successfully completed Music 30 or Drama 30. Preference will be given to a student pursuing studies in these areas. Selection will be made by the Barrhead Arts Council from applications received by BCHS. The recipient must provide proof of enrollment into a post secondary educational institution to collect the award.

Marty Pype Memorial Award (\$500)

Established in memory of Marty Pype a 1987 graduate. This award will be given to a student who demonstrates diligent work with commitment and effort and who has been involved in activities making the school a better place to be a student. The award is intended for a student not eligible for the Rutherford Scholarship. A student may apply or be nominated. Proof of enrolment into a post secondary institution must be provided.

Mandy Close Memorial Award (\$500)

Formed by the Lions Club to honor Mandy Close who succumbed to leukemia in her grade twelve year, 1985. This award is awarded annually to a graduate who has tried to maximize his/her potential in both school and

community activities. Preference will be given to someone actively involved in sports and music. Proof of enrolment into a post secondary educational institution within Canada must be provided.

Lowell Cramer Memorial Award (\$500)

The Lowell Cramer Memorial Award was established by the MTM Agricultural Society. It is available to any graduate in financial need who will be furthering his/her education in agriculture or a related field such as animal health or veterinary medicine. Selection will be made by the MTM Agricultural Society from applications received by BCHS. The recipient must provide proof of enrollment at a post secondary educational institution.

Lyla Hertz Memorial Award (\$150)

Bequeathed by Ms. Lyla Hertz, a teacher of many years in Barrhead. The Lyla Hertz Memorial Award is given to the top English 30 student in BCHS. No application is necessary.

Ray Nadeau Mathematics Award (\$100)

This mathematics award has been established in honor of Ray Nadeau, who taught at Lorne Jenken High School for 35 years. Ray was an excellent mathematics and chemistry teacher and was involved in extra-curricular activities such as badminton, basketball and football. Through the years his door was always open to students and his cheery smile and endless supply of stories entertained innumerable students over the years. This award will be given to the top Mathematics 30-2 student. No application is necessary.

Eileen Tymkow Memorial Award (\$300) Established in memory of Eileen Tymkow, one of the parents involved in bringing French Immersion to Barrhead. This award will be given to a student who has participated in the French Immersion Program and who illustrates good citizenship and involvement in school and community activities. The recipient must provide proof of enrolment into a post secondary institution.

Rollie Lonsdale Memorial Award (\$500)

The Rollie Lonsdale Award established to honour a 1987 graduate, will be given annually to a student who has worked to capacity but has not qualified for the Rutherford Scholarships. Proof of enrollment into a post secondary institution must be provided.

Purdy Award (\$100)

Established by Myrtle Wegner in memory of her parents, Donald and Mary Purdy, the Purdy award is presented to the top Social Studies 30 student. No application is necessary.

Haddie Kalmbach Memorial Award (\$200)

Donated by the local Barrhead Art Club in honour of a local artist active in the club until her death, the Haddie Kalmbach Memorial Award will be awarded to the most promising Grade 12 Art student as selected by the Barrhead Art Club. The applicant must be enrolled in an art related program at a post secondary institution and must

submit an application including a letter of intent as well as a portfolio containing at least six pieces.

Meadowview School Scholarship (\$500)

The Meadowview School Scholarship has been established to celebrate the many years that students were able to enjoy and benefit from the close and caring community spirit of this educational institution. This scholarship is open to

all former students that attended Meadowview School. In order to apply for this scholarship you must submit an essay (250 words) on what Meadowview School meant to you. Proof of enrolment in a post secondary institution must be provided to collect the award.

Nolan Preugschas Memorial Award (\$600) Established in memory of Nolan Preugschas, a grade twelve student in 1996 -97, this trust award is subsidized each year by Peak Swine Genetics Inc. This memorial award is given to a student who will enroll in an agricultural or business related

program. Preference will be given to an applicant who has been involved with 4-H and is active in sports and/or community activities. Proof of enrollment into a post secondary institution is required.

Dunstable Communities Historical Society Scholarship (\$1,000)

The Dunstable Communities Historical Society will provide a scholarship of \$1,000 to a student that has attended Dunstable School in the past and who intends to further his/her education. The successful candidate must have attended Dunstable School in their grade six year and priority will be given to a student that attended kindergarten to grade six in Dunstable

In order to apply for this scholarship you must submit an essay (approximately 250 words) on what the Dunstable Communities Historical Society has done in the community. Preference shall be given to a student whose parents/guardians still reside in the Dunstable community. Students must apply in the year in which they have graduated. Proof of enrollment in a post secondary educational institution must be provided to collect the award.

Barrhead Composite High School Bursaries (variable number @ \$300)

Barrhead Composite High School Bursaries are awarded preferably to honor students who intend to further their education. Each recipient must provide proof of enrollment into a post secondary educational institution to collect the award.

Dorine St. Pierre Memorial Scholarship (\$500)

Established in 2017 in memory of Dorine St. Pierre, the French Monitor and French Immersion Program Assistant at Barrhead Elementary School. Dorine was a long time advocate for the French Immersion Program and was very committed to the success of the program. The students she worked with appreciated her positive influence and cheerful attitude. Preference will be given to a graduate who is pursuing studies at the Faculte Saint-Jean or studying for a career in Education. Proof of enrolment into a post-secondary institution must be provided.

UNA Registered Nurse Bursary (\$500)

UNA local #136 will be awarding a scholarship of \$500 to a BCHS student enrolled in the first year of an approved Bachelor of Nursing (BN), Bachelor of Science of Nursing (BScN) or Registered Psychiatric Nursing post secondary program. The recipient must provide proof of enrollment into a registered nursing program at a post secondary institution to collect the award.

Country Crossroads Seniors' Society Bursary (\$500)

The Country Crossroads Seniors' Society provides a bursary of \$500 to a graduate who has achieved good marks through consistent effort. The successful applicant will NOT be eligible for Rutherford Scholarship funds. Proof of enrollment into a post secondary educational institution is required to collect the award.

Bruce Dick Memorial Scholarship (\$1,000)

Established in 2017 by Alberta BridgeWorks in memory of Bruce Dick. Bruce was a valued member of the BridgeWorks team. He was a 'people person' who cared about all those in his circle of influence. He was loyal, committed and someone who believed in an honest day's work. While he worked hard, he also played hard, appreciated life and loved his family and his job. This scholarship will be awarded to a student who demonstrates some or all of the characteristics that made Bruce Dick the man his family and co-workers admired and respected. Proof of enrolment into a post secondary institution, as well as a Social Insurance Number must be provided.

Lorna Stutchbury Memorial Scholarship (\$500)

This scholarship was established in 2019 in memory of Lorna Stutchbury, a long time resident of Barrhead. Education was always very important to Lorna. She attended school in Edmonton at Ross Shepard High School and was the valedictorian her Grade 12 year. She then attended University to become a school teacher. In 1963 after her marriage to Bill, Lorna moved to Barrhead where she taught school and raised a family. Lorna was very active in the community volunteering in many capacities over the years with organizations such as Kinettes. This scholarship will be awarded to a student enrolled in either the Education or Science faculty. Proof of enrolment into a post secondary institution must be provided.

Barrhead Composite High

George R. Schuurman Bursary (\$1000)

Donated by Pembina Hills Regional Division Local of the Alberta Teachers' Association, this bursary will be given to a student graduating from Barrhead Composite High School, Fort Assiniboine High School or Swan Hills High School planning to attend a post secondary institution and NOT be eligible for full Rutherford Scholarship funding. Proposed enrollment in teacher training is not a requirement but may warrant consideration. The recipient must provide proof of enrollment into a post secondary educational institution to collect the award.

Arie Moes Memorial Award (\$1000)

Established in memory of Arie Moes, a local dairy farmer and member of the Country Roads Holstein Club. In the essay portion of your response, please describe how this award will help prepare you for a successful career amidst all the change expected as agriculture progresses into the future. Proof of enrolment in a post secondary agriculture program will be given preference. Selection will be made by the sponsors of the award: The Country Roads Holstein Club and Martin Deerline. A separate application form (at the back of the booklet) must be completed for this award.

Pembina Hills Local, Alberta Teachers' Association Bursary (\$1000)

Donated by Pembina Hills Regional Division Local of the Alberta Teachers' Association to Barrhead Composite High School, this yearly bursary will be granted to a student planning to attend a post secondary institution. Proposed enrollment in teacher training is not a requirement but may warrant consideration. The recipient must provide proof of enrollment into a post secondary educational institution to collect the award.

Rehabilitation Bursary (\$500)

Sponsored by Barrhead Health Care Centre in Aspen Regional Health Authority, this Rehabilitation Bursary is available to a student entering a training program in rehabilitation disciplines such as Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Language Pathology, Recreation Therapy, Respiratory Therapy. If more than one application is received, the student with the highest mark in Biology 30 will be selected. Application is necessary.

Nolan Preugschas BarrWest Pork Award (\$1000)

Established in memory of Nolan Preugschas, a grade twelve student in 1996 - 97. This memorial award is given by BarrWest Pork Limited to a student who is pursuing post secondary studies in an agricultural or business related field. The recipient must provide proof of enrollment into a post secondary educational institution to collect the award.

Bio - Science Bursary (\$300)

A bursary of \$300 is provided by Dr. Grant Balen, Optometrist, for a graduate intending to enroll in a post secondary science program, preferably, but not necessarily, in biological sciences. Proficiency in high school science courses is expected. The recipient must provide proof of enrollment into a post secondary institution to collect the award.

BCHS Leadership Bursary (\$500)

BCHS Students' Council offers a bursary of \$500 to a graduate planning to obtain further education. A separate application to BCHS Students' Council outlining need for assistance and contributions to school and community is necessary. The recipient must provide proof of enrollment into a post secondary educational institution to collect the award.

Ron Pate Memorial Award (\$500)

The Ron Pate award established to honor Ron Pate, a teacher and counselor at BCHS, will be given each year to a student who demonstrates their personal best in all community and school activities. Preference will be given to a student who is involved in special needs, track and field and the trades. Proof of enrollment in a post secondary educational institution must be provided to collect the award.

Eric's Army Award (\$500)

Eric's army was established in recognition of the many people who have given Eric Vriend opportunity and believed in his abilities. This award will be for a person who

- tends to put others first
- looks for the positive
- works hard at building people up
- quietly and diligently makes the world around him/her a better place
- believes in people
- focuses on the positive, an attitude of 'yes we can' and sees the ability in people.

No application is necessary.

Pembina Hills Citizenship Award (2 @ \$500)

Pembina Hills Public School Board annually awards \$500 to two graduates exhibiting excellent citizenship. The board would like to recognize students who make positive contributions to their school and community with these two Citizenship Awards. An online application is required for this award. The application as well as the criteria for eligibility can be found on the PHPS website, under the Schools and Programs heading.

Barrhead Elks Foundation Award (2 @ \$1000)

This award will be given to two students who have demonstrated an interest in volunteering and good citizenship. The award began in 2003 and the focus is the common good of people as a whole. Volunteering in the community is a significant factor in selecting the successful applicant. Examples of volunteerism would be participation in the Cool Camp program as a teen leader, SADD, graduation council, leadership council, 4-H groups, girl guides, scouts, coaching extracurricular teams, and school and community events. A reference letter from one of the groups that accepted the volunteering student is required.

Dale & Maureen Greig Scholarship (\$1000)

This scholarship will be awarded annually to a graduate who is entering post secondary studies in agriculture or an agriculture related field (forestry, vet medicine, etc). Applicant must live in the Barrhead area, have attended BCHS and not have received Rutherford funding. Preference will be given to a 4-H member. If there are no applicants entering agriculture or a related field this scholarship may be offered to students entering any other program. Applicants should submit a short summary of their future plans. The recipient must provide proof of enrollment into a post secondary institution to collect the award.

Barr-North Veterinary Clinic Scholarship (\$500)

The Barr-North Veterinary Clinic would like to offer a \$500 scholarship to a student enrolled in post secondary education. Preference will be given to students who have shown an interest in large or small animal husbandry.

Barrhead Agricultural Society Scholarship (\$1,000)

The Barrhead Agricultural Society provides two awards of \$1,000 each to students who are pursuing a career in one of the following: Agricultural Related Studies, Community Programs or Trade Schools. The successful applicant must reside in the Barrhead area and have attended High School in Barrhead. Opportunity to attend the Alberta Association of Agricultural Societies Convention will be provided/encouraged. Priority will be given to students entering their first year of post secondary studies but second year students will also be considered. A separate application form (at the back of the booklet) must be completed for this award.

Math/Science Excellence Award (\$500)

This award is established by Jason and Lisa Schonknecht and will be given to a graduate who has excelled in their high school math and/or science courses. Active involvement within community and/or school activities must be demonstrated. Eligible students must also qualify for the Rutherford Scholarship. Preference will be given to students enrolling in a math and/or science post-secondary program. Proof of enrollment in a post-secondary institution is required.
